## Texts and Translations

Christ, Whose Glory Fills the Skies (text by Charles Wesley)

Christ, whose glory fills the skies, Christ, the true, the only Light, Sun of Righteousness, arise, Triumph o'er the shades of night; Dayspring, from on high, be near; Daystar, in my heart appear. Dark and cheerless is the morn unaccompanied by thee; Joyless is the day's return, Till thy mercy's beams I see; Till they inward light impart, Glad my eyes, and warm my heart. Visit then this soul of mine, Pierce the gloom of sin and grief; Fill me, radiance divine, Scatter all my unbelief; More and more thyself display, Shining to the perfect day.

Cantate Domino (Psalm 96:1-3)

*Cantate Domino canticum novum; cantate Domino omnis terra.*

*Cantate Domino, et benedicite nomini eius; annuntiate de die in diem salutare ejus. Annuntiate inter gentes gloriam ejus; in omnibus populis mirabilia ejus.*

(Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth.

Sing to the Lord, bless his name; proclaim his salvation day after day. Tell his glory among the nations; among all peoples, his marvelous deeds.)

Ave Verum Corpus (14th century, attr. Pope Innocent VI)

*Ave verum corpus natum ex Maria Virgine; vere passum, immolatum in cruce pro homine, cuius latus perforatum fluxit aqua et sanguine.*

(Hail, true Body, born of the Virgin Mary; who having truly suffered, was sacrificed on the cross for mankind, whose pierced side flowed water and blood.

*Esto nobis praegustatum. In mortis examine. O Iesu dulcis, o Iesu pie, O Iesu, fili Mariae. Miserere mei. Amen.* Let it [the Eucharist] be a foretaste [of heaven] in the trial of death. O sweet Jesus, O pious Jesus, O Jesus, son of Mary, have mercy on me. Amen.)

O Quam Gloriosum (Antiphon from All Saints Second Vespers)

*O quam gloriosum est regnum,*

*in quo cum Christo gaudent omnes Sancti!*

*Amicti stolis albis,*

*sequuntur Agnum, quocumque ierit.*

O how glorious is the kingdom in which all the saints rejoice with Christ, clad in robes of white they follow the Lamb wherever he goes.

Be Thou My Vision (Ancient Irish, tr. Mary E. Byrne)

Be Thou my Vision, O Lord of my heart; Naught be all else to me, save that Thou art. Thou my best Thought, by day or by night, Waking or sleeping, Thy presence my light. • Be Thou my battle Shield, Sword for the fight; Be Thou my Dignity, Thou my Delight; Thou my soul's Shelter, Thou my high Tower: Raise Thou me heavenward, O Power of my power. • Riches I heed not, nor man's empty praise, Thou mine Inheritance, now and always: Thou and Thou only, first in my heart, High King of Heaven, my Treasure Thou art. • High King of Heaven, my victory won, May I reach Heaven's joys, O bright Heaven's Sun! Heart of my own heart, whatever befall, Still be my Vision, O Ruler of all.
