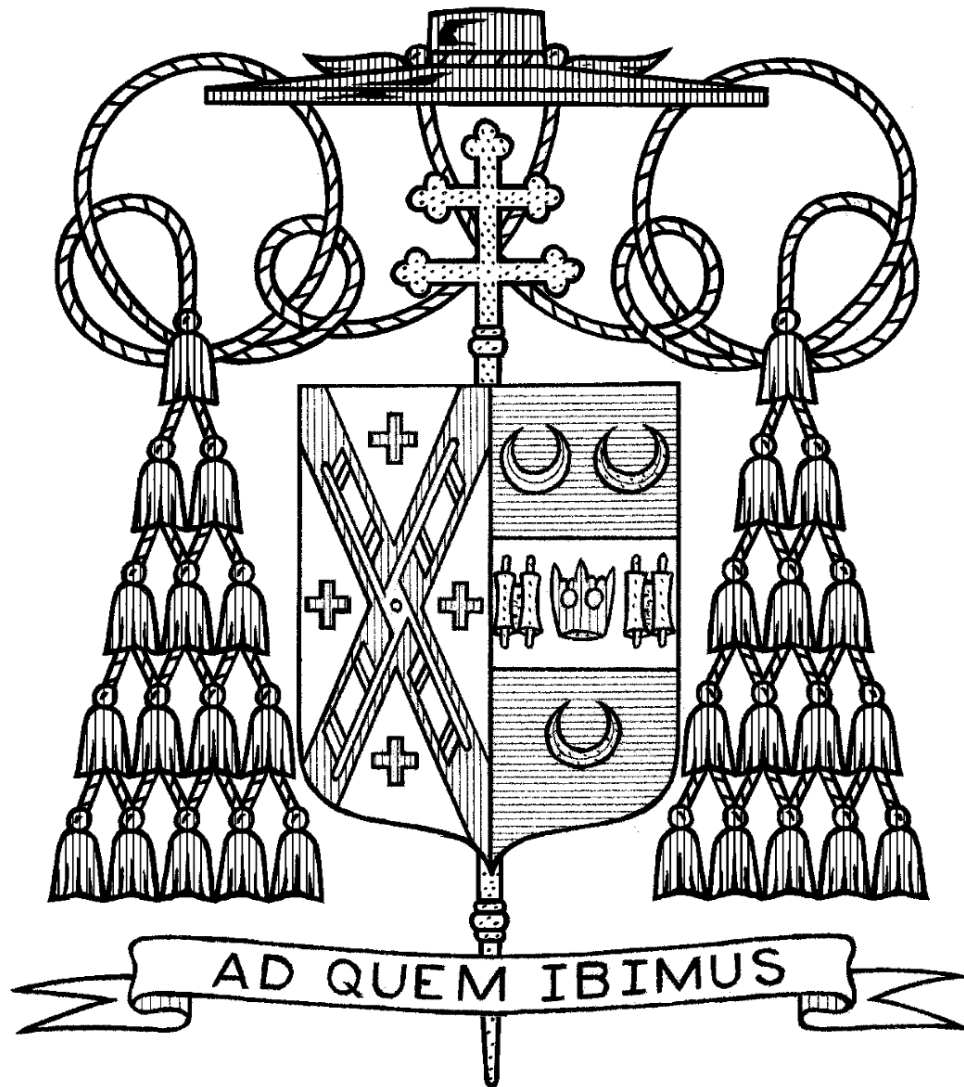

Brothers and sisters:

coming in human likeness;
and, found human in appearance,
